IKEA has some great ideas for dinner parties, like the Dlnera Dekala Japanese-inspired, 10-piece eating set. It retails for \$29 and comes in beige or grey.

The set comprises two rectangular stoneware plates (36cmx15cm), two bowls with lids (12cm) and two small bowls (9cm). There are also two solid acacia chopsticks with stoneware holders.

This is ideal for Japanese meal, such as sushi, miso soup and noodles; and great for TV snacks.

The stoneware is microwave- and dishwasher-safe.
