Mimmi Freebody, interior designer at MMM Interiors, shares her secrets to a stylish and practical bathroom.

1. Think outside the square for bathroom furniture while focusing on functionality and the best use of space.
2. If your bathroom is against a fence or does not have a view, create your own alcove outside with lattice, bamboo or shrubbery. Installing a floor-to-ceiling window will provide a view while the alcove provides privacy.
3. Aim to personalise your bathroom and cater to suit those in your home.
4. Be wise when introducing mirrors. If you have a large bathroom space and a lot of natural light, there is no need for a large mirror. In smaller areas, mirrors are able to give the illusion of space.
