Wood wins Miro

Fashion designer Antonio Miro has turned his hand from the sewing machine to the bathroom, creating two bathware designs for Paco Jaanson.

The collection revolves around the concept of "the essence being in the detail", and is said to reflect Miro's personality and flair in the fashion world.

"I do not want to be limited to fashion in a strict way. I am curious and open to new experiences," Miro said of the designs.

Miro has created the range from iroko wood — native to west Africa and known for being a tough, dense and durable wood, ideal for the bathroom. A focal point of the collection is the mirrors, which feature a built-in analog clock. The mirror frames are finished in a chocolate colour with ebony staining.

Miro said the natural timber tone allowed pieces to fit into any colour scheme.



The range also included big and small drawers, shelves and washbasin. The square basins were designed to be focal pieces that hold their own.

Miro cited Barcelona, art, music and architecture as the inspiration for the range.

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
